




The Results of Man's Fall Death (1)

I. Overview.

The second result of man's fall is death. The end result of sin is death. Because sin was passed from Adam to all the human generations after him, death was also passed on as well. Because of sin, man was driven out of the garden of Eden and cut off from the tree of life. The Bible tells us that man was alienated, or separated, from the life of God.



Because of sin and the fall, the end of all mankind is death and the grave.

III. Lesson.

Just as a glove is made in the image of the hand, God created man in His own image, in order that man could one day receive God's life. When God placed Adam in front of the tree of life, Satan understood what God's intention was – to share His life with man.

Satan's Plan to Destroy Man

God's enemy, Satan, made a plan to destroy man. Satan's plan had two parts. The first part was to get man to sin by dis-



obeying God by eating of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. The second part of Satan's evil plan was to keep man from eating of the tree of life.

Satan succeeded in his plan. Man disobeyed God, sinned, and ate of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Instead of life, man got death. Sin, the evil nature of Satan, came into man. Along with sin came death. Sin and death are inseparable. They always go together.

Through Sin, Death was Passed to All Men

Death works in man like a slow-acting poison. Through sin, death entered into man and began to work from that very moment. Man began to die. Day after day, man was not actually living, but was gradually dying. Each "birthday" was taking him a little closer to his grave. Each day he lived in slavery to the fear of death, and soon he would be entirely

subjected to the dominion of Satan, which is death. Because of the entrance of sin and death into man, he was fully corrupted and ruined for God's purpose. Therefore, God had to put Adam and Eve out of the garden and close off the way to the tree of life. Thus, Satan succeeded in separating man from the life of God.

Man's situation was hopeless. Utterly poisoned and corrupted and growing closer to death with each day he lived. Only God's redemption through Christ could provide man the way to be saved from his corruption and death and to bring man back to God and His purpose.
