


Crossword Puzzle

- Lesson Five -

The Results of Man's Fall

Sin (2)

I. Overview.

Sin separates man from God and brings in God's judgment. Today sin causes us to have a feeling of shame and guilt. In the future we all must be judged for all our sinful deeds. The Bible tells us that the penalty for sin is eternal torment in the lake of fire. The lake of fire is the place of eternal punishment which God has reserved for the Devil. But all who have sinned and reject God's salvation will also be sent to the lake of fire.



The lake of fire is the place of eternal punishment and separation from God.

The lake of fire is a place of eternal separation from God – a place of eternal torment. It is a place which God prepared not for man, but for the Devil and his followers. God's intention is for man to be with God. So, even after the fall of man and his corruption with sin, God still desires that all men would accept the salvation that He has prepared for them. If man refuses God's salvation, however, his destiny will be the lake of fire.

II. Memory Verse.

“It is reserved for men to die once, and after this comes judgment.”

(Heb. 9:27)

III. Lesson.

After Adam and Eve disobeyed God and sinned against Him they felt a sense of shame in their conscience. The Bible tells us that they “knew that they were naked”. Before sin entered into them, they knew no shame in God’s presence or in their own hearts.

The Knowledge of Sin

Because of their consciousness of their sin, they felt shame and guilt. These feelings caused them to do two things. Firstly, they clothed themselves with fig leaves to cover their shame. Secondly, they hid themselves from the presence of God. Today we know when we have sinned because we immediately feel guilty in our conscience. We also have a sense of shame. We also feel an immediate sense of separation from God. This sense is a warning given to us by God to tell us that we have sinned against Him and to cause us to repent and confess our sins.

The Result of Sin – Judgment and Condemnation

Sin not only causes us to feel guilt and shame today, but our sin will also be judged in the future. Just like when a driver finds a parking ticket on his car windshield, he feels bad at that moment, but also knows that he must appear in court in the future to face the judgment for what he has done wrong.

In the future, all men will stand before God’s throne of judgment and give an account of their life and deeds. Everything that we do is recorded in God’s record books and we will all be judged according to what we have done. Those people whose names are

not written in the Lamb’s book of life will be cast into the lake of fire and will suffer the same eternal punishment that the Devil will also suffer.

Separation from God Causes Pain – Today and Forever

Because of sin, man feels pain in his heart today. This pain is because of his separation from God. But in the future man will feel a much greater pain, even an eternal torment in the lake of fire that will have no end. This will be an eternal separation from God. This punishment was not prepared for man, but because man sinned against God and became corrupt, this is the destiny of all who refuse God’s salvation.
