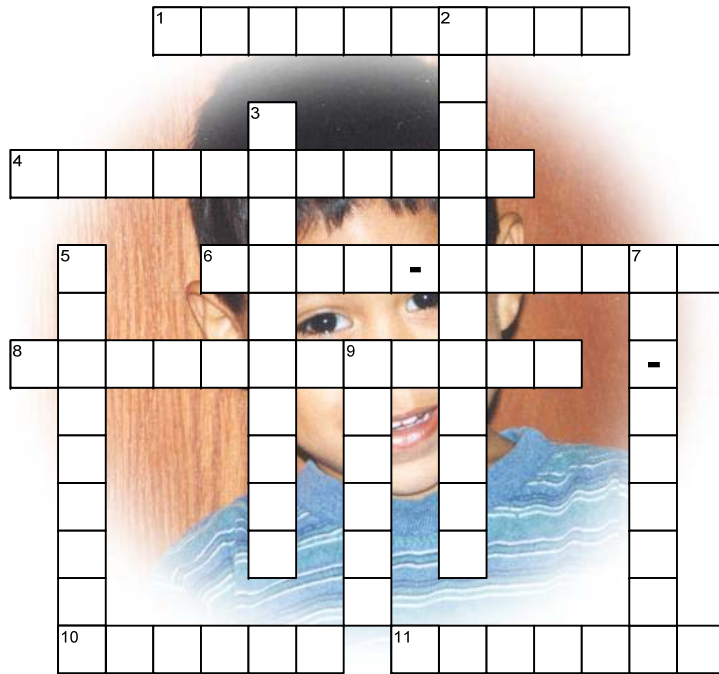

## The Ten Commandments

- Lesson Nine -

### The Fourth Commandment (2) The Lord's Day

#### I. Overview.

In the New Testament we are no longer required to keep the Sabbath. In the Old Testament the Sabbath was established by God for His people to remember Him as their Creator and to rest with Him on the seventh day. However, we do in the New Testament age set aside one day each week to remember the Lord Jesus. This is the first day of each week, the Lord's Day.

The Lord's Day, the first day of the week, is the day of our Lord's resurrection. On each Lord's Day we gather together to remember the Lord. To remember the Lord is to rejoice in His resurrection, to praise Him for all that He has done, and to bring our offerings to the Him with thanksgiving.



Now on the first day of the week at early dawn... they came to the tomb. Two men... in dazzling clothing... said to them, Why are you seeking the living among the dead? He is not here but has been raised!

### III. Lesson.

#### The Fourth Commandment

The fourth commandment was given by God to His people in the Old Testament. On the Sabbath day they were not supposed to do any work at all. They were to rest on the Sabbath day in remembrance of how God rested after He completed all His work of creation. When God was finished with His work during the six days of creation, He rested and was refreshed on the seventh day.

#### The Lord Jesus Fulfilled the Law

In the New Testament age we are no longer required to keep the Sabbath. This is because the Lord Jesus has died and fulfilled all the requirements of the Old Testament law. He told us in the gospels that He came to fulfill the law. Because He came and fulfilled the law we are no longer under the law of the Old Testament. We have been brought into the New Testament age where the Lord Himself is everything to us. The Lord replaced the Sabbath with Himself.

#### The Lord's Day

In the New Testament we as believers set aside one day each to remember the Lord. On this day, the first day of the week, we honor our Lord and remember Him according to His command. The Lord's Day was the day when the Lord turned His disciples' sorrow into joy through His resurrection. On this first Lord's Day, the day of resurrection, the Lord met with His disciples and encouraged them by

breathing Himself into them as the Holy Spirit. The Lord's Day is a day of rejoicing and praising the Lord.

#### The Church Meets on the Lord's Day

The church gathers together each Lord's Day to remember the Lord at the Lord's Table meeting. Also on this day, all the saints bring their offering to the Lord in thanksgiving for all of His blessings to them. The unbelievers call the first day of the week "Sunday" in honor of the sun. They use this day mainly for their own pleasure. The Christians respect the first day of the week as the Lord's day and use it in a special way to honor and remember their Lord and Savior.
