

Title – Animals

Main Burden – God created the other animals on the sixth day. God created all these animals for man to enjoy.

## I Introduction

1. Welcome the children, check any new ones or visitors, and learn their names.
2. Make sure the children know the teachers' names.

## II Notebook & Memory Verse

1. Ask the children who can say their memory verse from last week.
2. Allow those who know the verse to say it one by one.
3. Put sticker on their lesson next to the memory verse.

## III Review previous lessons

1. God is the Creator.
2. On the first day, God called light into being.
3. On the second day, He created the atmosphere, the sky.
4. On the third day, He brought up the dry land out of the waters and created the grasses and plants as the first kind of life.
5. On the fourth day, He placed the sun and the moon and the stars in the heavens for light during the day and during the night.
6. On the fifth day, God created fish in the sea and birds in the air.

## IV Lesson

1. After the fifth day, God still was not finished with His creation.
2. So He continued by creating more wonderful things on the sixth day.
3. "And God said, Let the earth bring forth living animals, according to their kind...  
Gen 1:24
4. God created the cattle and all the animals on the land.
5. They are a higher life with a higher consciousness than that of the fish and the birds.
6. God created many different kinds of animals.
7. There are wild animals like the lions, leopards, and tigers, etc. They live in the forest.
8. There are livestock, all kinds of cattle, sheep, goats, cows, and horses, etc. They eat the grass of the field.
9. These animals are for man to enjoy. For example, we enjoy riding on a pony or a horse.
10. Some of these animals give us food. Cows give us milk, and sheep give us wool...
11. These animals live on a farm.

12. There are some animals that live with us; we call them pets. Some of them can be man's companions. Some can also be man's helpers, like the watch dogs and the guide dogs, ...
13. God created all the different kinds of animals, and He also provides for all their needs.
14. Tall giraffes reach way up high to eat leaves from the trees.
15. Huge hippos wade in the rivers to keep cool.
16. God created all these animals for man to enjoy.

V Give each child his/her lesson sheet.

Read the lines on the lesson with the children, and have them repeat after you.  
You may want to repeat each line at least twice.

VI Memory Verse: (Say it to the children and then have them repeat with you several times)

"And God said, Let the earth bring forth living animals, according to their kind."

IX Craft – TP Roll Cow

X Preparation –

Read and pray over Genesis 1:24.

Make copies of the lesson and the coloring page for the children.

For the craft, you will need the following for each child:

- 2 toilet paper rolls •Paint, white, black and pink •2 egg carton sections •Cotton balls •Glue
- Scissors •2 googly eyes (optional, can use paint) •Small piece of pink pipe cleaner or felt
- Small piece of yarn or twine, for cow's tail

### **All Things Bright And Beautiful**

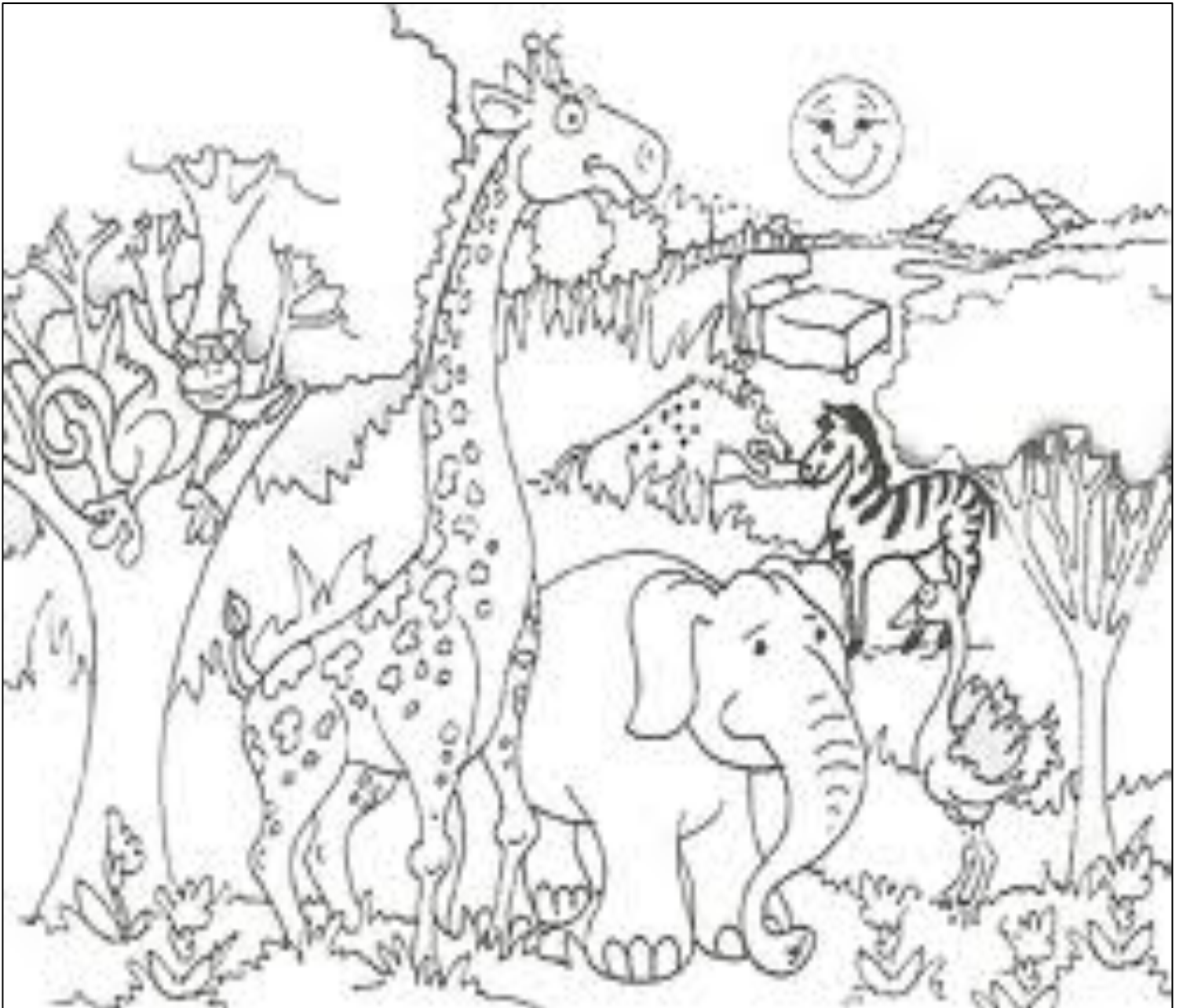

CRAFT:  
Toilet Paper Roll Cow

(This is a more complicated craft, preparing some of the parts ahead of time will be helpful.)



1. Cut one of the TP rolls in half (one half will be the cow's head). Cut about 1" from the other TP roll (this will be the cow's body). From each side of the cow's head, cut 2 rounded slits and fold out, these will be the cow's ears. From the top of the cow's head, cut two 'horns' and fold up (see picture).



2. Take your two egg carton sections and cut out the front and back of each. These will be the cow's legs.

3. You're ready to paint your cow! Paint each part white and make your cow spots black (or what ever color you'd like your cow to be), paint the inside of the ear pink and each horn grey, if you'd like. This would be a good time to glue or paint on your cow's eyes. Once the paint is dry, glue all of your parts together.



4. Put some cotton balls into each TP Roll. Make a mouth from a pipe cleaner, piece of felt, or what ever materials you have, and don't forget to attach a tail to your cow!
